It is important to report any weather-related damage. During your assessments highlight damage to:

- Residential and commercial property
- · Critical infrastructure including roadways, bridges, utilities for both local and state owned
- Waterways including stream and roadway water run off projects
- Flood control systems
- Emergency vehicle access impairment
- Public health and safety
- Recreation and parks
- Crop and/or livestock loss or damage

Attached is a copy of a PEMA DAP-19 "Local Damage Assessment Form". We understand that some information may not be available so please include as much information as you can. Along with this information please document with photos and/or video. Questions can be directed to our office.
